

## WHAT IS STRIPPING & GRADING?

Stripping and grading is the process of preparing land for development.

- Stripping involves the removal of grass, roots, and topsoil.
- Grading initatives focus on cutting, filling, and compaction to create a level base for construction of future utilities, roads, and buildings.

#### WHAT CAN I EXPECT FROM THIS PROCESS?

The WCDT is working proactively to minimize the impact of stripping and grading on our neighbours. The biggest by-product of this type of activity is dust. Other impacts can include noise and traffic congestion.

The WCDT has put into place a number of strategies to help manage these concerns:

- Reduced hours of operation in the evening over and above the City's noise bylaw.
  No work permitted before 7am or after 9pm
- Regular watering during strpping and grading activities to prevent blowing dust.
- Limited hauling routes for trucks transporting soil to other locations, on and off-site.
  WCDT is also working with Alberta Health Services to minimize hauling activity on roadways during Foothills and Children's Hospital staff shift changes.
- Regular street sweeping on periphery and internal main roads to clean up potential messes from hauling trucks.
- **Erosion control** measures such as silt fences and v-ditches to prevent soil from moving outside of the construction area.

The impact of stripping and grading is highly dependent on varying conditions. Windy, hot and dry weather will create more dust.
