

#### **BACKGROUND**

In 2015, the Trust began construction activity towards development of University District with efforts focused on stripping and grading. Early this spring, the team will complete the work that started in 2015, which makes way for the more comprehensive construction operation onsite (watch for details on that in the coming weeks).

## WHAT IS STRIPPING & GRADING?

Stripping and grading is the process of preparing land for development.

 Grading initiatives focus on cutting, filling, and compaction to create a level base for construction of future utilities, roads, and buildings.

## WHAT CAN I EXPECT FROM THIS PROCESS?

The Trust is working proactively to minimize the impact of construction on our neighbours. One of the by-products of this type of activity is dust. Other impacts can include noise and traffic congestion.

The Trust has put into place a number of strategies to help manage these concerns:

- Regular watering during construction activities to prevent blowing dust.
- Designated construction access and limited hauling routes for trucks transporting soil to other locations, on and off-site.
- Regular street sweeping on periphery and internal main roads to clean up potential messes from hauling trucks.
- **Erosion control** measures such as silt fences and v-ditches to prevent soil from moving outside of the construction area.
- Regular scheduled meetings with stakeholders including Alberta Health Services, Alberta Children's Hospital, and South Shaganappi Area Planning Group.

The impact of construction is highly dependent on varying conditions. Windy, hot and dry weather will create more dust.

#### **CURRENT ACTIVITIES**

May to June

Remain grading activities from 2015 including loaming and seeding for erosion control.

Once grading activities are complete, the site will be loamed and seeded for erosion an dust control. (This excludes the Phase 1 project sites which are slated for deep utility construction. See map on reverse.)
